

Rules 4, 5, and 7

- 1) A batter hits an over-the-fence home run. While running the bases he misses 2nd base. The umpire should call him out on appeal by the defense.

- 2) In which of these situations would the game NOT be a forfeit (chose all that apply):
 - a) A team is already short handed (8 in fast pitch or 9 in slow pitch) and a player gets injured with no available substitute.
 - b) A runner slides into 2nd and injures their ankle and has to leave the game. The team does not have a substitute available.
 - c) A pitcher (P1) is removed from the pitching position in the 6th inning after a team's 4 defensive conference. P1 comes back into pitch in the 7th inning and gets disqualified with no available substitute.
 - d) B1 is ejected from the game for using an altered bat and the team does not have an available substitute.
- 3) (Fast Pitch) The DP bats 4th in the line-up. In the 3rd inning, the DP plays defense for F5 who bats in the 6th position. In the 5th inning the FLEX, listed 10th, bats for F5.
- 4) (Slow Pitch) The manager turns in a line-up with 10 names. Prior to the start of the game an 11th player arrives and the manager decides to make him the EP and bat him last, but does not tell the umpire, official scorer, or opposing team. The player comes to bat in the 2nd inning. The defense brings this to the umpire's attention while the player is at bat with a 2-1 count. The umpire should just replace the batter with the lead off hitter.
- 5) R1 on 1st, B3 comes to bat instead of B2. R1 steals 2nd. B3 singles sending R2 to 3rd. Prior to the next pitch the defense appeals the batting out of order.
 - a) Who is the proper batter? _____
 - b) Where is R1 placed? _____
- 6) The batter takes a pitch, but steps on the plate. The umpire should call the batter out.
- 7) The batter swings at a pitch that bounces in front of the plate and hits the ball over the fence. The umpire should award the batter a home run.
